AFC Urgent Care - Dale City is pleased to offer immigration physical exam services. Dr. Delroy Anglin is a licensed US Civil Surgeon who has been authorized by the US Immigration Service to conduct immigration physicals for the Department of Homeland Security. Individuals applying for citizenship or seeking permanent residency (a “Green Card”) are required to obtain an immigration physical performed by a designated Civil Surgeon prior to approval of their application. The exam results will be recorded on Form I-693 for the applicant to return to the US Immigration Service. The exam process is done in two parts:

First, you will come in to fill out your application and have your vital signs taken and blood drawn for the required tuberculosis and other tests. If you need additional immunizations, you will be informed at that time.

Once the tests are completed and the results are received, you will then be scheduled to be examined by Dr. Anglin. He will complete the exam, sign off on the form, and provide you with a sealed copy which you will submit to USCIS. We will provide you with an unsealed copy of the documents for your own records.

IMMIGRATION PHYSICAL EXPLANATION OF PRICES as of August 1, 2024

Adult Physical Exam Fee, includes Basic Physical Exam and Lab Work (tuberculosis and STD, tests, as necessary) **\$395.00**

Please note additional tests and vaccines may be required, at additional cost, based on the patient's age and documented vaccination history.

Those tests and vaccines that can be administered by us on site are as follows:

Chest X-ray (2 view)	\$110.00
MMR Titer (if required) (results available in 7 days)	\$130.00
Varicella Titer (if required) (results available in 7 days)	\$210.00
Vaccine Administration Fee (each vaccine)	\$ 40.00
Influenza Vaccine, age >65 years	\$ 55.00
Influenza Vaccine, age <65 years	\$ 55.00
Pneumonia Vaccine (Pneumovax23)	\$180.00
MMR Vaccine	\$130.00
TDAP (Adacel)	\$ 95.00

Hepatitis A (per shot, three are required)	\$120.00
Hepatitis B (per shot, three are required)	\$110.00

You may be required to receive additional vaccines which we do not provide. If so, we will direct you to the appropriate facility to receive those immunizations.

Procedures

What to expect

The Immigration Physical as required by USCIS is a complex and comprehensive examination that is performed in several different parts.

We have developed a system to ensure the quickest processing and shortest wait times possible. Your exam will take place in two separate visits. **On the first visit, you will pay the \$395 examination fee. This fee is non-refundable.** At your initial visit, you will be provided the USCIS Form I-693 application. Please bring your medical records as requested below. We will review your documentation, and tell you what additional information, if any, will need to be provided at the time of the exam.

We will take blood samples for your tuberculosis and STD tests, which are required, at that time. We will also consult with the doctor and order any additional immunization shots, if necessary, at that time.

The exam fee does NOT cover additional vaccinations, examination, testing or treatment. If you need additional immunizations, testing, x-rays or other items, you will be provided with a cost estimate, which will be due at the time of service.

We must set an appointment for you, as we do not do exams on a walk-in basis. Once we have the information, we will prepare your examination record as required by USCIS. We will then set an appointment for you to return to be seen by the doctor. Depending on your records, the follow-up exam will be scheduled one to two weeks afterwards.

What to bring to your initial visit to the clinic:

1. **Valid, government issued picture ID** such as a valid passport (preferred), driver's license, green card, or military ID.
2. **Medical records** (translated to English by an official translator, if necessary), including proof of prior treatment for tuberculosis or other infectious disease and prior chest X-ray reports.
3. **Immunization records** (translated to English by an official translator, if necessary).
4. **Any mental health records** (translated to English by an official translator, if necessary).
5. **An immigration physical Form I-693** (OMB No. 1515-0033, Form Edition Date 3/09/23, which expires on 3/31/2025), pre completed with your information IN CAPITAL LETTERS. Please make sure this form is up to date and the most current form available from the US Immigration Service. We will be happy to provide you with a copy of the correct form.

On Exam day:

If you do not speak fluent English, you must bring a translator with you. The cost of your translator is at your expense, and you will not be reimbursed by AFC Urgent Care - Dale City.

Please budget at least 2 to 3 hours for this process on the first day and a total of two business days spread out over 1 to 2 weeks, depending on the necessity of additional testing (Saturday exams may take longer for labs to process). Additional labs may be needed at an additional expense and may require up to 1 to 2 weeks for a result, depending on the test.

If you require immunization shots, we will administer them at the exam. If you require a hepatitis vaccine, please note they are administered in three separate injections, which the doctor will explain to you. We keep all vaccines listed above in stock. If you require a vaccine we do not have, you will be given a prescription, which can generally be filled at most local drug stores.

After the Exam:

Once the immigration medical examination is completed and all immunizations and/or lab tests have been performed, we will provide you with a certified Form I-693 in a sealed envelope to present to the Department of Homeland Security and US Immigration Service. **DO NOT OPEN THE SEALED ENVELOPE.** Turn in the sealed envelope with your immigration application. A copy of the blood tests results and exam will be provided to you to keep after results have been discussed with the doctor.

The medical examination will only be valid up to a year after the immigration exam date. **Our physician will not certify or sign your Form I-693 until all medical exam and additional testing fees have been paid. Fees are required to be paid at the time of service.**

Typically, you will be notified of the results of your lab work (and chest X-ray, if done) within 7 to 10 days. If you have a health condition requiring medical follow-up, clearance will not be granted until follow-up is completed. You will be responsible for the cost of any additional medical examinations or treatments required to fulfill the federal health requirements of the US Immigration Service.

AFC Urgent Care - Dale City does not provide or guarantee bilingual or multilingual staff. **It is your responsibility to bring a translator and have all your necessary immunization and medical records translated into English by an official translator to expedite your exam process.**

To schedule your initial medical exam appointment, you are required to pay the \$395 examination fee. All remaining expenses must be paid at the time you check in for your exam. If you cancel your appointment with less than 48 hours' notice or do not show for your appointment your \$395.00 deposit is non-refundable. You will be required to pay an additional non-refundable deposit of \$200.00 deposit to reschedule another appointment. We accept cash, American Express, Visa, MasterCard, or Discover credit cards. **Checks and debit cards are not accepted for these services.**

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Does AFC Urgent Care - Dale City perform medical exams for immigrants from other states?
Our US Immigration Service certified Civil Surgeon physician is Delroy Anglin, MD. Dr. Anglin can perform exams for all states from our center, which is located at 4101 Cheshire Station Plaza, Woodbridge, Virginia 22193.

Q: Will my insurance cover the cost of the immigration physical exam?
No. We ask you to pay your \$395 examination fee at the first visit, and pay your bill in full at the time you check in for the exam with the doctor.

Q: How much does the immigration physical cost?
The cost of the basic immigration medical exam is \$395.00. This includes blood work (test for tuberculosis and certain sexually transmitted diseases), physical exam, and follow up consultation to pick up results and certified forms. If you need a chest X-ray, blood titers for immunizations, or other testing there would be an additional charge (see attached sheet for general pricing). There will also be an additional charge if a confirmation syphilis test is needed and/or other testing as required by the US Citizenship and Immigration Service. All fees must be paid at your time of service. You will be required to pay a non-refundable deposit of \$200.00 at the time you make the appointment. If you cancel your appointment with less than 48 hours' notice or do not show for your appointment your \$395 examination fee is non-refundable. You will be required to pay an additional non-refundable deposit of \$200.00 to reschedule another appointment.

You will be required to pay the any other fees (x-ray, immunizations, treatments, on an as-needed basis) when you arrive for your appointment with the doctor.

Q: How long will it take before the results and documents are ready?
Your forms will be ready in 5 to 7 business days depending on results from laboratory testing. Off-site laboratory test results usually return within 5 to 7 business days (Monday through Friday, not including holidays). The tuberculosis test, which we do in the clinic, must be read between 48 to 72 hours from original test. Our medical staff are the only ones that can read the test. If the tuberculosis test is positive, a chest X-ray is required, which can add another a few days to the process. Chest X-rays are administered in our center at an additional cost, see fee schedule for general pricing. You will be required to return to our center to review your results and pick up your certified forms.

Q: Can I get my chest X-ray and blood work done somewhere else and bring the results with me to my medical exam?
We prefer that your chest X-ray be done at our facility. However, if you have had a chest X-ray within the past year, bring the results with you to your exam and we will decide on a case-by-case basis if the x-ray is acceptable. Results must be signed by the physician completing the test or interpretation. See the general pricing sheet above for the cost of a chest X-ray in our facility.

Q: Are immunizations included in the price for my immigration medical exam?

No. The cost of immunizations and their administration cost extra. Depending on which immunizations you are required to have based on age, gender, and condition, will determine which must be completed before your immigration exam can be completed. Most of the required immunizations can be obtained from AFC Urgent Care - Dale City and done at the time of your exam. If you need additional vaccinations that we do not provide, we will give you instructions on where to receive them at your appointment with the doctor. See the list above for pricing on those that we can complete for you, for an additional cost. Immunizations and their administration must be paid for at the time of service.

Q: Are other laboratory testing required and included in the price for my immigration exam?

Yes. The US Immigration Service recently announced changes to the Tuberculosis Component of the exam and now requires the Quanti-FERON Gold TB blood test. This test is drawn here and sent to an outside reference lab.

Q: Is there a waiver available for applicants who cannot afford the required vaccinations?

No. The US Immigration Service determines which vaccinations are required and there are no exceptions.

Q: When receiving immunizations from a health department does our physician have to sign Form I-693, or can the health department immunization physician/staff sign it?

You may get immunizations from the health department or other licensed health care facility, and bring the documents with you during your exam. Our Civil Surgeon will review them, and sign off on Form I-693 accordingly.

Q: Does our physician have to complete both the Vaccination Table and the Results section to properly complete the vaccination portion of the Form I-693?

Yes. US Immigration Services requires our physician to completely fill out the vaccination table and the Results section. Our physician must note in the vaccination table the complete vaccination history, date(s) of vaccinations given by us, and any waiver requests.
